Thunder Bay Regional Health Sciences Centre is currently recruiting for a full-time **Medical Oncologist** to join our Regional Cancer Program in Northwestern Ontario

The Thunder Bay Regional Health Sciences Centre (TBRHSC) is a state of the art, 395 bed acute care facility servicing the entire region of Northwestern Ontario, with a population of 250,000 residents. We are home to the Northern Ontario Regional Cancer Centre and the Thunder Bay Regional Health Research Institute. We are affiliated with the Northern Ontario School of Medicine and are the Regional Level II Trauma Centre for all of Northwestern Ontario.

The Regional Cancer Program provides a full continuum of cancer services for the residents of Northwestern Ontario. The team includes: 5 Medical Oncologists, 3 Haematologists, 4 Radiation Oncologists, and a Palliative Care Specialist who works closely with our program. Team members participate in clinical trials, clinical research and student teachings with the Northern Ontario School of Medicine (NOSM) and the Thunder Bay Regional Research Institute (TBRRI). The Medical Oncology Program sees approximately 1200 new patient visits each year. The program treats all major disease sites and provides supervision for patients receiving treatment in 11 Regional Satellite Clinics throughout the region.

Remuneration/ Incentives: This position is funded through an Alternate Funding Plan (AFP) with the Ontario Medical Oncologist Association (ONTMOA). On call stipend is offered. Relocation costs are covered up to \$3000.00 and recruitment and retention incentives are offered through Health Force Ontario, up to \$80,000.00 if eligible.

Qualifications and Position Requirements: Candidates must be certified in Medical Oncology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (or equivalent), have an MD, hold an independent license with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO). Any additional training in would be advantageous. All candidates must be either Canadian citizens or permanent residents.

The city of Thunder Bay offers a perfect balance of urban and rural life including affordable housing, excellent schooling at all levels and incredible outdoor opportunities for the healthy living enthusiast. Thunder Bay provides a vibrant, culturally diverse community with access to fine dining and the arts, all of which make this community a wonderful place to live, work, or raise a family.
