Position Summary:

The Department of Medicine and the Division of Medical Oncology at the University of Ottawa and The Ottawa Hospital is looking for an academic Medical Oncologist to join a group of 28 academic physicians.

Responsibilities:

The successful candidate will function as an academic physician. This position will consist of a full-time practice treating predominantly genitourinary malignancies. The position includes assignment of a minor site, based on the operational needs of the division.

Qualifications:

The successful candidate must hold an MD degree; be a member of, or be eligible to be a member of, the Canadian Medical Protective Association; have, or be eligible for certification in Medical Oncology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and have, or be eligible for, licensure in Ontario; and, be eligible for an academic appointment at the University of Ottawa, Faculty of Medicine at the rank of Assistant Professor or higher. Applicants must demonstrate specialized training and/or significant experience in managing genitourinary malignancies. Preference will be given to applicants who have experience advancing the care of patients with GU malignancies and/or clinical research in GU malignancies. Preference will be given to candidates with a higher degree (Masters, PhD), or specialist fellowship training.

The University of Ottawa and The Ottawa Hospital are bilingual institutions and therefore in the case of potentially successful candidates of equal ability, a bilingual (French/English) candidate would be preferred.

Additional Information:

The Ottawa Hospital Cancer Centre is the primary provider of medical oncology services to a mixed urban and rural population of 1,500,000 in Eastern Ontario, has approximately 4,000 new solid tumor medical oncology consults annually, offers a full spectrum of oncology services, and is a Canadian leader in oncology training and clinical research. Cancer is a priority focus for The Ottawa Hospital (one of Canada's largest teaching hospitals) and for the Ottawa Hospital Research Institute. The vision of The Ottawa Hospital is "to provide each patient with the world-class care, exceptional service and compassion that we would want for our loved ones."
