The *Bringing Equitable Access to Advanced Molecular Testing for Canadians with Cancer* Coalition is a collaborative coalition of patient advocates, clinicians, academic centers, diagnostic manufacturers and pharmaceutical companies. Our vision is that all Canadian oncology patients, regardless of where they live, should receive timely and appropriate advanced molecular testing in order to receive the optimal therapy for them, giving them the greatest chance of treatment success and the greatest opportunity to live their best life.

The Coalition will aim to educate, shape policy, and improve public access to advanced molecular diagnostic testing for all oncology patients – working to enable a healthcare system wherein this type of comprehensive testing is the norm.

CAMO National Virtual Mentorship Program

In 2021, CAMO launched a pilot national virtual mentorship program with great success. Overall, we received positive feedback from participants and to build on the momentum from last year, the first group event of year 2 of the mentorship program was held on November 18, 2022. The event brought over 40 participants together, including 26 mentors and 17 mentees from across Canada. Our guest speaker Dr. Lorelli Nowell, Eyes High Postdoctoral Scholar at the Taylor Institute for Teaching and Learning, University of Calgary, launched the event with an engaging discussion on various types of mentorship, and offered tips for optimizing group versus one-on-one mentorship opportunities. Medical oncology residents and fellows had the opportunity to interact with various CAMO mentors in small group breakout sessions. It was wonderful to see so many new and familiar faces, and to have the opportunity to connect with colleagues from across the country.

Based on feedback we received from last year's program, more than half of mentees and mentors expressed an interest in assigned one-on-one mentorship. Therefore, this year we will be piloting a new initiative of pairing mentees with a CAMO mentor for 1-on-1 mentoring. An introductory email has been sent with details on how to connect.
